Vicious Vikings

 <p>Maths</p> <p>The children will be working hard learning about place value and the 4 rules of number. They will be learning about fractions, shape and measure and statistics. The children will be given lots of opportunities to apply their learning to "real life" maths problems.</p>	 <p>English</p> <p>As a class we will be improving our reading skills by sharing historical texts on the Vikings. As a class we will be sharing Beowulf and using this text as a stimulus for our own writing, including character descriptions and newspaper articles.</p>	 <p>SCIENCE</p> <p>In Science the children will be learning about light, sight and sound. This will include investigating sources and how they travel.</p>
 <p>Geography</p> <p>The children will continue to develop their knowledge of the world. We will look at where the Vikings came from and how they travelled to England.</p>	<p>History</p> <p>The children will learn about the Vikings. This will include what life was like as a Viking and why they invaded Britain.</p>  	 <p>Art/DT</p> <p>Alongside our Viking topic children will create art related to the Vikings and also create a model of a Viking longboat. They will also learn about world famous artists and create work in their style.</p>
<p>PE</p> <p>Children will be developing skills in athletic activities including running, jumping and throwing.</p>	 <p>French</p>	 <p>Music</p> <p>The children will listen to a range of different music and express their opinion about pieces.</p>
 <p>Computing</p> <p>In Computing we will be developing our presentation skills using programmes such as PowerPoint. This will include inserting and changing images, resizing text and images and also saving and editing files.</p>	 <p>RE</p> <p>In RE we will be looking at special books and thinking about 'Why the Bible is so important to Christians today.'</p>	<p>Homework</p>  <p>Each week the children will receive spelling and times tables via Seesaw. It is also absolutely essential that your children continue to read at home at least 5 times per week, this can be done using a book they have at home, reading buddy or anything else they enjoy reading.</p>
